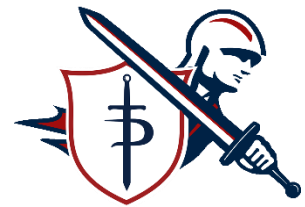

Students must demonstrate academic and developmental readiness, diligence in previous academic endeavors, and the potential to contribute to the community of scholars at Providence Classical Christian School. Admission testing (K-SEALS and PCCS Admissions Testing) is required in addition to standardized test scores and a personal interview.

Curriculum

Classical Christian education designed to develop the skills for a lifetime of continued learning as disciple, scholar, and citizen. Students earn high school credit in 8th grade for Algebra, Latin, and Science. Students have the opportunity to take dual-enrollment and CLEP courses to earn college credit. Graduates have earned the HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarships. Curriculum Distinctives: Latin 4th-9th Grade, Formal Logic, Rhetoric I and II, Great Ideas of Western Civilization I and II, Biblical Hermeneutics and Apologetics, Ancient History and Literature, Western Civilization I and II History and Literature, British and American Literature, Biblical Greek, Conceptual Physics, Science Seminar, Honors-Level Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II and PreCalculus, and Art and Music from Kindergarten – 12th grades.

Fine and Performing Arts

Students participate in annual choral performances, art exhibits and contests, as well as a semi-annual theatrical performance. PCCS students have earned recognition as the GAPPS State Literary Champions in addition to regularly earning first place in the Regional GAPPS Literary and One-Act competitions.

Rhetoric Projects

Students participate in formal speech and debate as part of the Rhetoric I and II classes. Community presentations are presented to the entire school and local community. Prospective graduates complete a Senior Thesis as the capstone to the academic requirements for all graduates. Students work with a faculty advisor in developing the thesis. Students must present and successfully defend the Senior Thesis before a faculty panel and the community as a graduation requirement.

All students from 1st – 12th grade participate in the annual Speech Meet competition. Students memorize and present a selection of Bible, prose, poetry, or historic speech lasting from 3 – 5 minutes.

Athletics

The athletic program includes: Varsity and Junior Varsity Volleyball, Varsity and Junior Varsity Cross-Country, Middle School and Junior Varsity Basketball. PCCS students have participated and earned recognition at the State and Regional level for GAPPS Volleyball and Cross Country.

Field Trips and Activities

Students participate in a variety of field trips to include: United Kingdom, Charleston, S.C., NASA, Chick-fil-A Headquarters, Desoto Caverns, High Museum, Carlos Museum, Hillsdale College, Wycliff Bible Translators, Covenant College, Fernbank, Stone Mountain, Georgia Aquarium, Coca-Cola Museum, Mitcham Farms, Historic Courthouse Newton County, Shakespeare Tavern, Top Golf, Six Flags Physics Day, Fire Station, Biblical History Center, Saint Augustine, Classics Department University of Georgia, Greek Festival, and Covington Fuzz Run. Activities/Service includes: Reformation Day, Grant-A-Wish, Operation Christmas Child, Change the World, Newton Pregnancy Resource Center, Johnny Appleseed Day, 100 Day of School, National Pro-life Sidewalk Chalk Day, Pioneer Day, Cowboy Day, Greek and Roman Day, Colonial Day.

Standardized Test Scores

Students in 3rd through 8th grades take the Comprehensive Testing Program (CTP 5) annually. Providence student scores are consistently well above the national average on all standardized tests from 1st-12th grades. High school students take the Christian Learning Test (CLT and CLT10).
