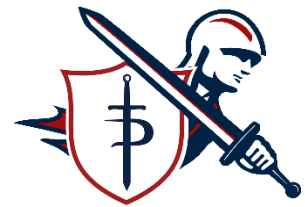




# PROVIDENCE CLASSICAL CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

### Admissions

Students must demonstrate academic and developmental readiness, diligence in previous academic endeavors, and the potential to contribute to the community of scholars at Providence Classical Christian School. Admission testing (K-SEALS and PCCS Admissions Testing) is required in addition to standardized test scores and a personal interview.

### Faculty

The faculty consists of 15 full-time and 6 part-time teachers. All faculty members have bachelor's degrees, and several have master's degrees.

### Fine and Performing Arts

Students participate in annual choral performances, art exhibits and contests, and theatrical performance. PCCS students have earned recognition as the GAPPS State Literary Champions in addition to regularly earning first place in the Regional GAPPS Literary competition.

### Curriculum

Classical Christian education includes structure that rewards self-control and personal diligence, content and method that develop thinking, articulate students, and an environment that challenges students and creates a love of learning. Students earn high school credit in 8<sup>th</sup> grade for Algebra. Students have the opportunity to take dual-enrollment and CLEP courses to earn college credit. Graduates have earned the HOPE and Zell Miller Scholarships. Curriculum Distinctives: Latin 4<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> Grades, New Testament Greek 10<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> Grades, Formal Logic, Rhetoric I and II, Great Ideas of Western Civilization I and II, Biblical Hermeneutics and Apologetics, Ancient History and Literature, Western Civilization I and II History and Literature, British and American Literature, Conceptual Physics, Natural Philosophy, Honors-Level Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II and PreCalculus (Calculus is an elective), and Art and Music from PreKindergarten – 12<sup>th</sup> grades.

### **Rhetoric Projects**

Students participate in formal speech and debate as part of the Rhetoric I and II classes. Community presentations are presented to the entire school and local community. Prospective graduates complete a Senior Thesis as the capstone to the academic requirements for all graduates. Students work with a faculty advisor in developing the thesis and must present and successfully defend the Senior Thesis before a faculty panel and the community as a graduation requirement.

All students from 1<sup>st</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade participate in the annual Speech Meet competition. Students memorize and present a selection of Bible, prose, poetry, or historic speech lasting from 3 – 5 minutes.

### **Athletics**

The athletic program includes: Middle School and Varsity Volleyball, Middle School and Varsity Cross-Country, Middle School and Varsity Basketball. PCCS students have participated and earned recognition at the State and Regional level for GAPPS Volleyball and Cross Country.

### **Field Trips and Activities (*partial list*)**

Students participate in a variety of field trips: Europe, Charleston, S.C., NASA, Chick-fil-A Headquarters, Desoto Caverns, High Museum, Carlos Museum, Hillsdale College, Wycliff Bible Translators, Covenant College, Fernbank, Stone Mountain, Georgia Aquarium, Coca-Cola Museum, Mitcham Farms, Historic Courthouse Newton County, Shakespeare Tavern, Biblical History Center, Saint Augustine.

Service Activities include: Reformation Day, Operation Christmas Child, Change the World, Walk for Life.

### **Standardized Test Scores**

Students in 3<sup>rd</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grades take the Comprehensive Testing Program (CTP5, sponsored by ERB) annually. Providence student scores are consistently well above the national average on all standardized tests from 3<sup>rd</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades. High school students take the Christian Learning Test (CLT10 and CLT) and PSAT.
